Old Comedy and Aristophanes

I Aristophanes was HEIR OF TWO VERY PRODUCTIVE GENERATIONS OF COMIC POETS When he started his career, comedy had enjoyed 50 years of productions in an official context A thriving period for Athenian theatre, with ever increasing official investment in it A golden period for comedy Names of predecessors and early contemporaries:

My admiration for Aristophanes, an exponent of political satire, raised the question of whether his techniques are applicable in a modern context From my knowledge of theatre a hypothesis occurred suggesting there might be few differences between Aristophanes' techniques in political satire and those of modern satirists
